No restrictive gifts or designated funds will be accepted at this time.

Donor understands that Embers of Hope is currently awaiting confirmation and formal recognition of its tax-exempt status retroactive to its incorporation date of May 22, 2024 (see attached legal counsel letter in email). Embers of Hope expects to receive this formal recognition which will allow donations to be deducted for federal income tax purposes. Donor agrees that if this approval is not obtained from the Internal Revenue Service, donor will not deduct contributions on their federal income tax return. Embers of Hope will notify all donors as soon as determination is provided by the Internal Revenue Service.

Donor agrees that their donations will not exceed \$100 per month, or \$1,200 per year.
